

We believe that opening a child's eyes to what is, opens their minds to what could be.


Since 1971, we have been making a positive difference in the lives of Regina's youth by developing and implementing a wide range of mentoring programs for both in school and outside of school.



Outcomes

Our 2017 / 2018 results are as follows:

Out of the 250 youth served across Regina, Moose Jaw & Weyburn, 20% were surveyed and the following outcomes were gathered

45/49 (91.8%) of youth served saw an improvement in class attendance

39/49 (79.5%) of youth served saw an improvement in academic performance

42/49 (86%) of youth served saw an increase in taking responsibility for behaviours and actions

35/49 (71%) of youth served saw an increase in acquiring new life skills.






Where it went...

Independent Auditors Report

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Members of Big Brothers Big Sisters of Regina and Area Inc.

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Big Brothers Big Sisters of Regina and Area Inc., which comprise the statement of financial position as at June 30, 2018 and the statements of revenues and expenditures, changes in net assets and cash flows for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditors' Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.



Independent Auditors Report

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditors' judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

In our opinion, the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Big Brothers Big Sisters of Regina and Area Inc. as at June 30, 2018 and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.


